Dear Ms. McCallum:

Pursuant to the authorities set forth in House Resolution 503 and the rules of the House of Representatives, the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol (“Select Committee”) hereby transmits a subpoena that compels you to produce the documents set forth in the accompanying schedule by November 23, 2021, and to appear for a deposition on November 30, 2021.

The Select Committee is investigating the facts, circumstances, and causes of the January 6th attack and issues relating to the peaceful transfer of power, in order to identify and evaluate lessons learned and to recommend to the House and its relevant committees corrective laws, policies, procedures, rules, or regulations.

You served as National Executive Assistant to former President Trump’s 2020 re-election campaign. The Select Committee’s investigation and public accounts have revealed credible evidence that you are aware of, and participated in, efforts to spread false information about alleged voter fraud in the November 2020 election, as well as efforts to encourage state legislators to alter the outcome of the November 2020 election by, among other things, appointing alternate slates of electors to send competing electoral votes to the United States Congress.¹ For example, there is a publicly available recording of a voicemail that you left for an unknown Michigan state representative. In the recording, you wanted to know whether the Trump re-election campaign could “count on” the representative and you told the representative that he/she had the authority to appoint an alternate slate of electors based on purported evidence of widespread election fraud.²

Accordingly, the Select Committee seeks documents and a deposition regarding these and other matters that are within the scope of the Select Committee’s inquiry.
