Dear Mr. Klukowski:

Pursuant to the authorities set forth in House Resolution 503 and the rules of the House of Representatives, the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol (“Select Committee”) hereby transmits a subpoena that compels you to produce the documents set forth in the accompanying schedule by November 23, 2021, and to appear for a deposition on November 29, 2021.

The Select Committee is investigating the facts, circumstances, and causes of the January 6th attack and issues relating to the peaceful transfer of power, in order to identify and evaluate lessons learned and to recommend to the House and its relevant committees corrective laws, policies, procedures, rules, or regulations.

The Select Committee’s investigation and other inquiries have revealed credible evidence that you know about, and may have participated in, attempts to involve the Department of Justice in efforts to encourage states to submit alternate slates of electors. You worked with Jeffrey Clark, a former Department of Justice official who proposed that the Department send a letter to state legislators in Georgia and other states suggesting, among other things, that they delay or otherwise affect certification of their election results based on purported widespread voter fraud.¹ You communicated with Mr. Clark about that letter, and Mr. Clark contacted you before he attended a meeting at the White House during which he tried to oust Acting Attorney General Jeffrey Rosen and assume the role of Acting United States Attorney General.²
